
early Novem-We enber. courage each student to reflect on their involvement in the Great Commission and the opportunities that they have to make a difference in their world one per-

Late last month Dave, along with missionaries Paul and Sandy Kazim, took part in an outreach focused on children of Tabasco, providing diapers, formula and other essentials to people hit hardest by the disaster. In January, we're planning a return trip to offer medical attention and spiritual counseling to many of



those who have not been reached by government programs.

It has been encouraging to see God unifying the church as local pastors, themselves flood victims, have been volunteering their time and efforts to reach out to others with greater needs. Pray that, through these coordinated efforts, God will reveal himself and transform lives in Tabasco.
